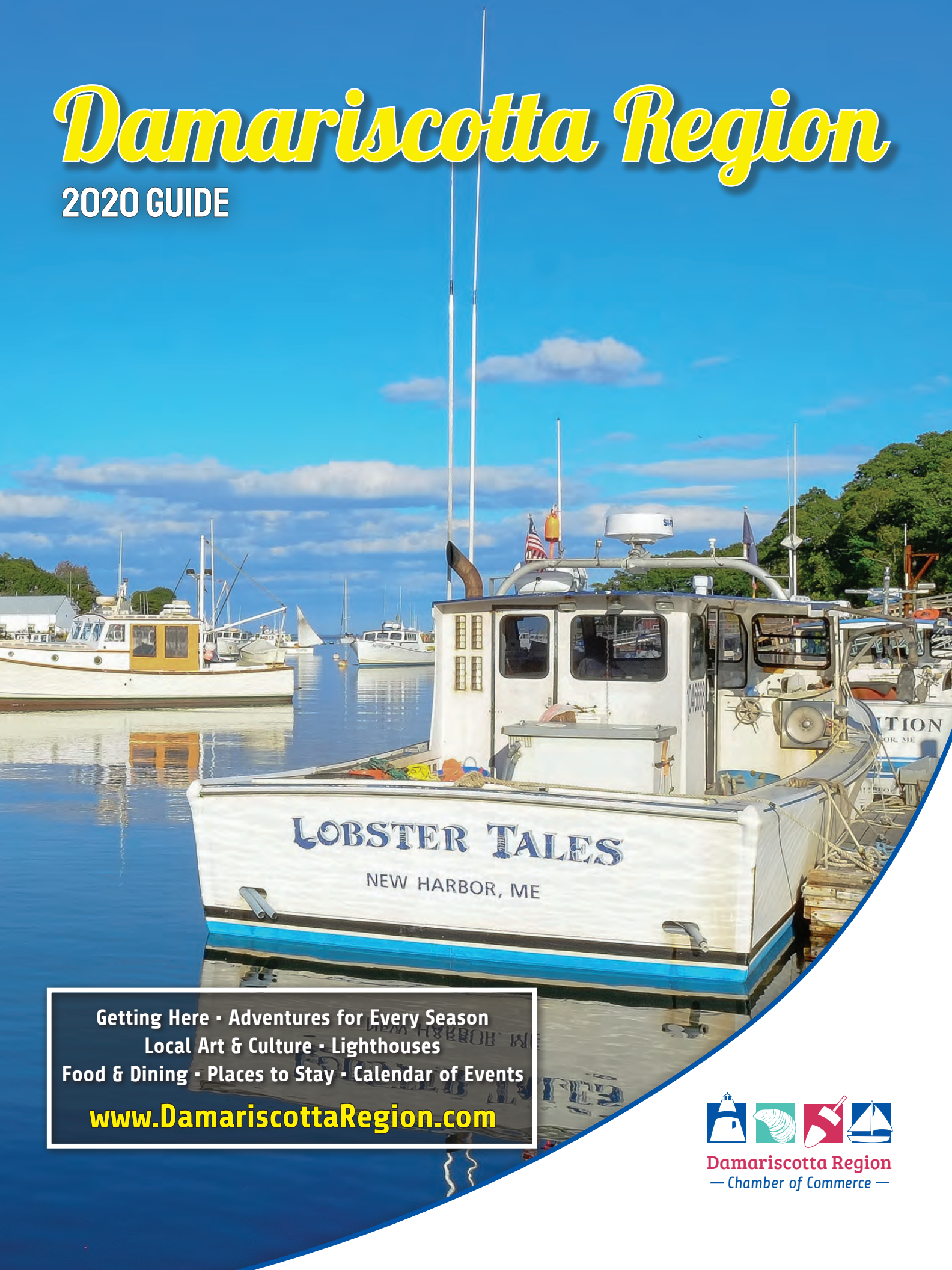

WELCOME TO *Maine's* BICENTENNIAL 2020

Happy 200th birthday, Maine! This year, we celebrate Maine becoming the 23rd state on March 15, 1820. However, Native Americans have called Maine home for thousands of years.

In the 1620s, a number of English settlements were established along the coast of Maine, but most failed. As Maine entered the 18th century, only a half dozen European settlements had survived. **Loyalist** and **Patriot** forces contended for Maine's territory during the **American Revolution**. During the **War of 1812**, the largely-undefended eastern region of Maine was occupied by British forces, but returned to the United States following failed British offensives on the northern border, mid-Atlantic and south which produced a peace treaty that was to include dedicated land on the Michigan peninsula for Native American people.

The Damariscotta-Newcastle region has a rich history that includes all of the chapters you'd expect - boatbuilding, military history and a maritime culture that reads like a novel. The mid coast's Twin Villages of Damariscotta/Damariscotta Mills and Newcastle are uniquely positioned along the banks of the

Damariscotta River, which once hosted a variety of boatbuilding operations beginning in the mid 1700's. As King George of England reserved the great tall white pines of Maine for the Royal Navy's ship masts, an industry began, which included boatbuilding, sawmills, lumberyards, blacksmith, and rigging shops. Schooners, brigs and sailing ships were built for New England merchants and were widely acclaimed for their speed and strength. The area produced more vessels than any other state in the nation at that time, and those vessels were sailed around the world.

Take time to breathe in the fresh air, while creating joyful memories.

History buffs will feel right at home in the area, and have a number of sites to explore that reach back hundreds of years. Some notable sights include the **Colonial Pemaquid Historic site**, which consists of seventeenth-century

Fort William Henry and eighteenth-century Fort Frederick. Fort William Henry was the largest of its kind in New England when originally built in 1692 by the colony of Massachusetts. The original structure was destroyed in 1696 by New France in the Siege of Pemaquid, but was reconstructed in 1908. The **Friends of Colonial Pemaquid** share many historical re-enactments from musket demonstrations, pirate strikes to musical entertainment from Maine St. Andrews Pipes and Drums at the historic site beginning Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day weekend.

Visit **Castle Tucker in Wiscasset, an historic, ornate mansion with tours, offering insight into the life of its 19th-century owner, a sea captain.** Other sites to see include **Fort Edgecomb Historic site** in Edgecomb, the **Thompson Ice House** in South Bristol, and the **Maine Maritime Museum** in Bath.

Whether it's history, the mountains, thousands of miles of rocky coastline, Maine-made products, cuisine, or the endless options for exploration and adventure, we welcome you to the area. Take time to breathe in the fresh air, while creating joyful memories.

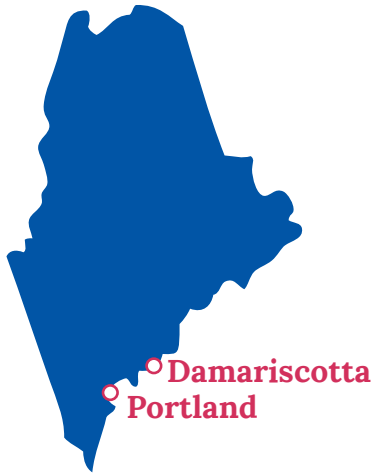

FOUR SEASONS TO LOVE

From pumpkins and oysters to Christmas lights and ice harvest, each season brings a new slate of offerings for both locals and visitors of the Damariscotta Region. In addition to our Calendar of Events (page 40) with the seasonal schedule of happenings in the area, be sure to look into some of these off-season celebrations.

SPRING

Spring is an exciting time in Maine as the days stay lighter a bit longer, lilacs, forsythia and apple trees come into bloom, and whales arrive hungry to feast in local waters. As the ground begins to thaw, locals ditch their winter boots and head out to hike mid-coast Maine's many state parks and recreational areas, Restaurants and other seasonal businesses begin to open their doors along the coast.

The "Alewives Festival" marks the first festival of the season on Memorial Day Weekend. Local alewives, sea-run fish that are members of the herring family, spend most of their lives at sea but return each May and June to spawn in Damariscotta Lake. The Fish Ladder, originally built in 1807, has recently been restored and is the central focus as it provides an up close and personal viewing of the alewives as they work

their way up the ladder, migrating from sea to lake. The festival is filled with fun, adventures, music, educational exhibits, a 5K run and food to tantalize and intrigue the entire family.

In late May, fields of purple, lavender, pink and white blossoms can be found throughout the area. Take a drive by the Newcastle Inn to view the gorgeous field full of Lupine.



SUMMER

Summer in Maine is like a smorgasbord – there are so many attractions you might not know where to start. From kayaking, river cruises, whale watching, hiking, birding, swimming in the lakes, going to the beach, visiting a lighthouse, enjoying a round of golf at Wawenock Golf Club in Bristol, to enjoying one of Maine's many islands, the options are endless. For a unique Maine experience, hop aboard the Bennie Alice at Pier 6 in Boothbay Harbor and enjoy a narrated scenic cruise while you take in Maine's

breathtaking coastline. You will arrive at Cabbage Island where you will enjoy a traditional Downeast clambake. Book a Hardy Boat Cruise, recently honored with the "Governors Award for Tourism Excellence" to Monhegan Island where you will experience the remains of a shipwreck plus breathtaking views of the Atlantic ocean.

For the adventurous at heart, enjoy a day sea kayaking along Maine's rocky scenic coast. Maine Kayak offers half day, full day and multi island overnight camping experiences.

Bristol's rich history lends itself to a multitude of events and happenings on the Pemaquid Peninsula. The annual Olde Bristol Days celebration each August on the Old Fort Grounds at Colonial Pemaquid draws the community and visitors together with a weekend filled with a parade, lobster boat races, vintage car shows, a chicken barbecue dinner, fireworks and so much more. This is a good ole-fashioned, small town celebration.



FALL

As the weather begins to cool down, the smell of fall arrives bringing burning wood, the sounds of crunching leaves, the tastes of crisp apples and sweet cider, and the brilliant sight of yellows, reds and oranges of fall foliage.

In October on Columbus Day weekend, ginormous gourds flood the streets of Damariscotta and Newcastle for the

annual Damariscotta Pumpkinfest & Regatta. Tens of thousands of visitors from around the world arrive for a fun filled family weekend. Imagine 70 decorated Atlantic Giant Pumpkins lining the streets, a giant pumpkin drop, pumpkin bake-off, pumpkin parade, pumpkin derby and people racing inside giant pumpkins with motors at the pumpkin

regatta. The weekend is a foodie's paradise of regional delicacies, music, and good old fashioned fun!

Celebrate autumn in the Sheepscot Valley at the annual fall festival at Wasscasset, Waterville & Farmington Railway Museum. Enjoy steam train rides, Model T rail car rides, a pumpkin patch, children's games, live music and hayrides.



WINTER

As the days become shorter and temperatures drop, Maine in winter becomes a special place, especially enjoyed by locals. What's not to love about curling up in front of a warm fire, enjoying a cup of hot cocoa, or the great outdoors. Maine has more than a dozen ski areas, 14,000 miles of groomed trails for snowmobiling, and lakes and ponds for ice fishing.

Thanksgiving weekend, the Twin Villages of Damariscotta and Newcastle come alive with the Villages of Light Festival featuring the Parade of Lights,

Santa's arrival in a horse drawn sleigh, and Main Street lined with decorated Christmas trees. Jake Day panoramas appear in the windows of Milling Around Antiques & Gifts. The handiwork of this beloved local artist becomes magical when viewed after dark.

Be sure to bundle up for Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens in Boothbay for Gardens Aglow. New England's biggest and brightest light display runs from late November through the end of the calendar year and features more than 650,000 lights! Spend time before and

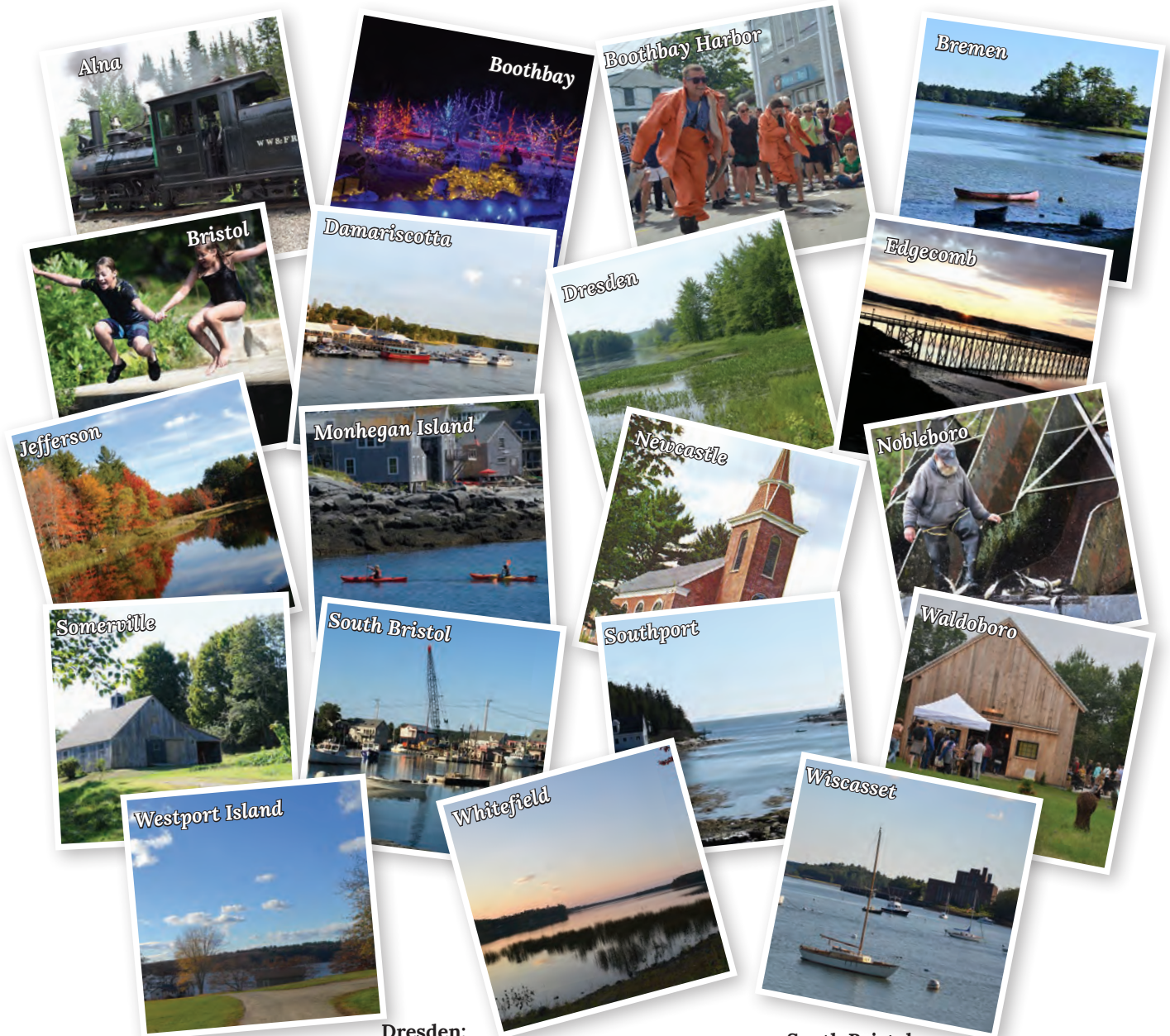
after your visit to enjoy the Boothbay Festival of Lights.

The traditional ice harvest at the Thompson Ice House in South Bristol is a fun-filled event for all ages. The free event attracts crowds every February to participate or watch as a crew of volunteers cut large blocks of ice from Thompson Pond using antique tools. The ice harvested during the event is later used to make ice cream for the Thompson Ice House Preservation Corp's annual ice cream social in July.

“NAPA VALLEY OF Oysters”

The Damariscotta River in mid-coast Maine is quickly earning the reputation as the “Napa Valley of Oysters.”

Thousands of years ago, shell heaps made up mostly of oyster shells lined the banks of the Damariscotta River (old Abenaki for “river of many fishes”) deposited there by Native Americans.

These oyster shell heaps tell a story about how the aboriginal people feasted on this delicacy.

The European settlers in the 1700s built mills, dams and shipyards, which led to erosion along the banks of the river and waste, which eventually led to the disappearance of the oyster.

Today, the 19-mile long tidal river offers undeniable beauty in addition to

its edible bounty, providing a continual pulse within the area. More than 80 percent of Maine oysters are farmed on the river, which boasts the perfect climate for harvesting oysters. The waters are cleaner and warmer with the right level of salinity and a fresh water mix. Commercial oyster growing and the prolific spawning have brought back the wild American oyster to perfection.

You too can become a connoisseur of oysters, which are offered at most restaurants in the region. For a unique experience, take a sunset river cruise up the Damariscotta River, where you will enjoy oysters, as you cruise past oyster farms, seals lounging on boulders, and hopefully, you’ll catch a glimpse of osprey and bald eagles. If enjoying a lazy day with views of the river is what you’re

looking for, take a drive to Barbara Scully’s Oyster & Lobster Market where you can grab some oysters, shucking tools, and other seafood delicacies and head to one of the picnic tables to enjoy your feast with friends. Don’t forget to bring your favorite beverage.

In late September, on the banks of the Damariscotta River, the Pemaquid Oyster Festival is in full swing with educational exhibits, boat trips, local vendors, music, and loads of delicious Pemaquid Oysters. Typically, more than 10,000 oysters are shucked during the one-day festival, benefitting the Edward A. Myers Marine Conservation Fund.

to craft and craft making, including woodcraft and fiber arts supplies, fabric, beads, and pottery. There is no shortage of sources for making your own masterpiece or taking one home!

Entertainment abounds in this area, and we are lucky to have diverse and ever-changing access to many cultural events. Several choral and musical ensembles call this area home, including the DaPonte String Quartet, Tapestry Singers, St. Cecilia Chamber Choir, Lincoln County Community Theater, and the Heartwood Regional Theater Company. The historic Lincoln Theater offers movies, live performances and live simulcast concert, opera and film showings all year long, featuring The Metropolitan Opera, world-renowned ballet companies like the Bolshoi and New York City Ballet and the Royal Theatre.

Bibliophiles will be pleased to find a book shop with a bustling café and the Skidompha Library right on Main Street. Don't miss Skidompha's Secondhand Book shop for even more take-home treasures!

Take a drive to Pemaquid Craft Co-op on your way to the lighthouse where nearly 60 crafters display their juried wares in 15 rooms of the co-operative shop. All products are made in Maine by Maine residents and range from pottery, jewelry, jam, chocolates, photography, fine art, and quilts, to children's toys, wooden furniture, baskets, and stained glass.

The list of famous artists who have been drawn to the Maine Coast is long, and it's no wonder. Most people who visit once begin planning their next visit before they leave, and sometimes the return is permanent! The area is beautiful in all seasons and the drama of our coastal landscape strikes the artist in all of us. The Damariscotta-Newcastle region is filled with several galleries and creative sources to appreciate art and even inspire yourself. Several artist-owned galleries and antique shops are located on Bristol Road, just a short distance away from the village. The downtown Damariscotta area features both traditional fine art and photographic art galleries as well as shops devoted exclusively

Maine has more than 65 lighthouses, which have become icons of coastal Maine, luring tens of thousands of visitors to the state each year. The mid-coast area alone has 21 lighthouses adorning its coastline. Today, most lighthouses serve an aesthetic purpose versus a practical one, however, the one thing that bridges history are the stories of shipwrecks, survival, and secrets hidden inside each one.

The **Pemaquid Point Lighthouse**, commissioned by John Quincy Adams in 1827, has the Fisherman's Museum on the first floor in the Keeper's House. It

has its own piece of history at the end of the peninsula. Located on the west side of the entrance to Muscongus Bay, its pyramidal tower stands 79 feet above sea level with a light that is visible for 14 nautical miles. Built in 1835 and automated in 1934, the Lighthouse received its first fourth-order Fresnel lens in 1956. The lighthouse was the first in Maine to be automated, rather than being hosted by a keeper in 1934. Visitor's can climb the winding stairwell to the top of the historic Point Lighthouse.

Each year the United States Coast Guard, the Maine Office of Tourism

and the American Lighthouse Foundation attract between 15,000 to 18,000 visitors annually, offering the general public a unique opportunity to climb and learn about more than two dozen historic Maine lights. The 2020 Maine Open Lighthouse Day is September 12 from 9:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. The lighthouses listed below can be easily visited from the mid-coast area. Check out the website for a complete listing of lighthouses that are a part of the 2020 Open Lighthouse day at www.lighthouse-foundation.org.

Squirrel Point 1898 - White wooden octagonal tower. East bank Kennebec River, Georgetown, view from Parker Head Road, Phippsburg Center.

Perkins Island 1898 - White wooden octagonal tower. West side of island, Kennebec River, view from Parker Head Road, Parker Head.

Seguin Island 1795/1887 - 53-foot white cylindrical tower, 2 miles south of Kennebec River mouth, Georgetown, view from Popham Beach

Hendricks Head 1829/1875 - 39-foot white square tower, privately owned, Southport Island, Sheepscot River,

Burnt Island 1821 - 26-foot white conical tower. West side, Boothbay Harbor entrance, Southport; view from Spruce Point, Boothbay Harbor.

The Cuckolds 1892/1907 - 48-foot white wooden octagonal tower atop

dwelling. Off Cape Newagen, west side entrance to Boothbay Harbor, view from town dock, Newagen.

Ram Island 1883/1977 - 30-foot white cylindrical tower, northwest side of island, east side of Boothbay Harbor entrance, view from Ocean Point, Route 96, East Boothbay.

Pemaquid Point - 32-foot white fieldstone conical tower, Pemaquid 1827/1857 Bristol, end of Route 130.

Monhegan 1824/1850 - 47-foot gray granite conical tower, 10 miles offshore, Monhegan Island, via car ferry from Boothbay Harbor, New Harbor, Port Clyde.

Franklin Island 1805/1857 - 37-foot white cylindrical tower, northwest side of island, Muscongus Bay, Friendship.

Marshall Point 1832/1858 - 25-foot white granite tower with footbridge. Southern tip of Marshall Point, east side southern entrance to Port Clyde Harbor entrance, view Lighthouse Road off Route 131. St. George.

Tenants Harbor 1857 - 26-foot white cylindrical tower, privately owned. East side of Southern Island, view from the village.

Two Bush Island 1897 - 42-foot white square tower. Off Tenant's Harbor, north side Two Bush Channel.

Whitehead Island 1807/1852 - 34-foot gray granite tower, west side, southern entrance to Muscle Ridge Channel. Off Tenant's Harbor, St. George.

Rockland Breakwater 1888/1902 - 18-foot white square tower atop fog signal house. North side, Rockland Harbor entrance, Rockland.

Owl's Head Lighthouse 1825 - 20-ft white brick conical tower, south entrance to Rockland Harbor, view from Lighthouse Road off Route 73.

Indian Island 1850/1874 - 31-ft white square tower, privately owned, no longer active. East side off Rockport entrance, view from Rockport Marine Park.

Curtis Island 1836/1896 - 26-foot white cylindrical tower. Camden Harbor entrance, view from Bay View Street, Camden.

Grindel Point 1851/1874 - 32-foot white pyramidal tower, privately owned. Islesboro, auto ferry from Lincolnville Beach; north side entrance to Gilkey Harbor.
