

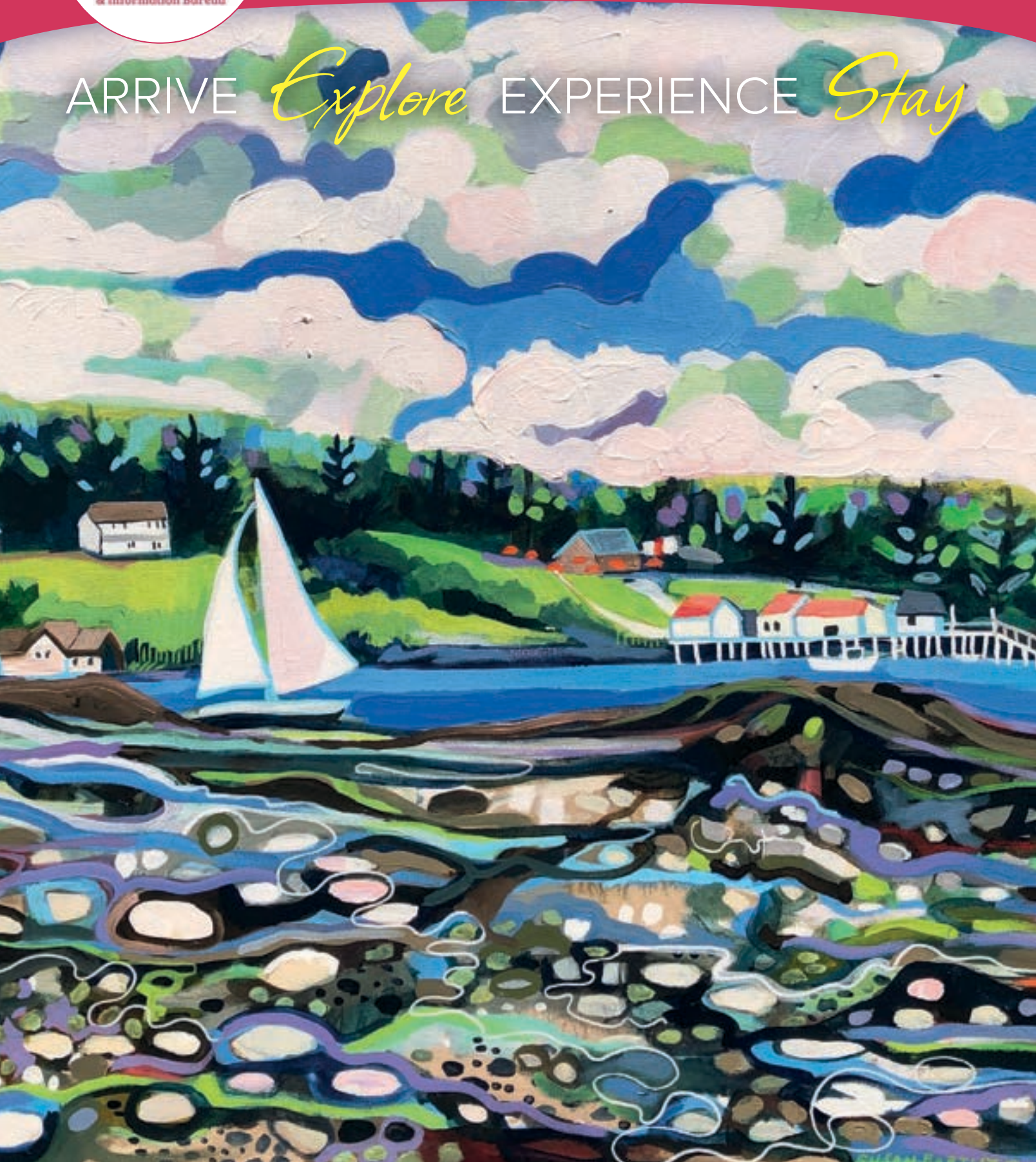

There’s no stopping the beautiful memories you will capture in Midcoast Maine. Whether it’s our history, beautiful sunrises and sunsets over the lakes, rivers, and ocean, adventures on water and land, thousands of miles of rocky coastline, lighthouses, charming villages, freshly caught seafood, brilliant foliage, the mountains or winter adventures, we welcome you to the area. Take time to breathe in the fresh air, while creating joyful memories.

Our History

In the 1620’s, a number of English settlements were established along the coast of Maine, but most failed. As Maine entered the 18th century, only a half dozen European settlements had survived. Loyalist and Patriot forces contended for Maine’s territory during the American Revolution. During the War of 1812, the largely-undefended eastern region of Maine was occupied by British forces, but returned to the United States following failed British offensives on the northern border, mid-Atlantic and south which produced a peace treaty that was to include dedicated land on the Michigan peninsula for Native American people.

The Damariscotta-Newcastle region has a rich history that includes all of the chapters you’d expect - boatbuilding, military history and a maritime culture that reads like a novel. The midcoast’s Twin Villages of Damariscotta/Damariscotta Mills and Newcastle are uniquely positioned

along the banks of the Damariscotta River, which once hosted a variety of boatbuilding operations beginning in the mid 1700’s. As King George of England reserved the great tall white pines of Maine for the Royal Navy’s ship masts, an industry began, which included boatbuilding, sawmills, lumberyards, blacksmith, and rigging shops. Schooners, brigs and sailing ships were built for New England merchants and were widely acclaimed for their speed and strength. The area produced more vessels than any other state in the nation at that time, and those vessels were sailed around the world.

History buffs will feel right at home in the area, and have a number of sites to explore that reach back hundreds of years. Some notable sights include the **Colonial Pemaquid Historic site**, which consists of seventeenth-century Fort William Henry and eighteenth-century Fort Frederick. Fort William Henry was the largest of its kind in New England when originally built in 1692 by the colony of Massachusetts. The original structure was destroyed in 1696 by New France in the Siege of Pemaquid, but was reconstructed in 1908.

The **Friends of Colonial Pemaquid** share many historical re-enactments from musket demonstrations, pirate strikes to musical entertainment from Maine St. Andrews Pipes and Drums at the historic site. Visit **Whaleback**, an 11-acre property in Damariscotta owned by the Maine Bureau of Parks and Lands and operated cooperatively with Coastal Rivers. The site once contained a massive oyster shell heap, or midden, formed over a period of more than 1,000 years by Native Americans. The shells were processed for chicken feed in the late 1800’s, leaving behind just a fraction of the original mounds. Interpretive storyboards relate the history of the middens, their accumulation and destruction, and also share stories of the Upper Damariscotta River.

Visit Castle Tucker in Wiscasset, an historic, ornate mansion with tours, offering insight into the life of its 19th-century owner, a sea captain. Other sites to see include **Fort Edgecomb Historic site** in Edgecomb, the **Thompson Ice House** in South Bristol, and the **Maine Maritime Museum** in Bath.

FOUR SEASONS TO LOVE

From adventures in nature, oysters, and pumpkins to holiday lights and ice harvest, each season brings a new slate of offerings for both locals and visitors to the Damariscotta Region. In addition to our **Calendar of Events** (page 42) with the seasonal schedule of happenings in the area, be sure to look into some of these off-season celebrations that will draw you into the beauty of our region.

SPRING AHEAD

Spring is an exciting time in Maine as the days stay lighter a bit longer and everything begins to show signs of rebirth. Lilacs, forsythia and apple trees come into bloom, and the common loon, the beautiful waterbird with the haunting call, returns to the lakes and ponds to nest along the shore. Turtles commune on logs to catch the warm rays of the sun, and ospreys can be seen returning to their large nests built on top of pilings to incubate their eggs.

As the ground begins to thaw, locals ditch their winter boots and head out to hike Midcoast Maine's many state parks and preserves or kayak the area's recreational spots.

Alewives begin running in May. These sea-run fish, which are members of the herring family, spend most of their lives at sea but return each May and June to spawn in Damariscotta Lake. The **fish ladder in Damariscotta Mills**, which was originally built in 1807, has recently been restored and is the central focus, providing an up close and personal viewing of the alewives as they work their way up the ladder, migrating from sea to lake.

In late May, as you are driving the highways, back country roads, or shoreline in Maine, look for the beautiful carpet of purple, pink and white lupines in fields, or on the side of the road. If you miss these perennials, take a drive to Northern Point Road in Round Pond to the Lupine field to experience this wonderful mix of colors.

Spring is a bit of a tease but an exciting time in Maine, knowing that summer is right around the corner.

SUMMER SPECTACULAR

Summer in Maine is a celebration of the senses—so much to take in and enjoy that you may not know where to start. From kayaking, river cruises, whale watching, camping, hiking, birding, golfing, lake swimming, shelling, exploring one of Maine's many islands, the options are endless. For a unique Maine experience, hop aboard the *Bennie Alice* at Pier 6 in Boothbay Harbor and enjoy a narrated scenic cruise while you take in Maine's breathtaking coastline. You'll arrive at **Cabbage Island** where you will enjoy a traditional DownEast lobster bake.

For the adventurous at heart, enjoy a day sea kayaking along Maine's rocky scenic coast or on the lakes. **Midcoast Kayak** on Main Street in Damariscotta and **Maine Kayak** in New Harbor offer half day, full day and multi-island overnight camping experiences to make your adventure memorable.

Pemaquid Beach in New Harbor is a beautiful crescent-shaped beach with soft white sand, gentle waves and the clearest water possible. You can rent chairs, umbrellas, and beach toys, and enjoy lunch as

you watch the tide gently roll in, and roll out. Beachcombers Rest and Nature Center features beach plants and animals to view through a microscope, as well as a touch tank.

Bristol's rich history lends itself to a multitude of events on the Pemaquid Peninsula. The annual **Olde Bristol Days** celebration each August on the Pemaquid Beach Park draws the community and visitors together with a weekend filled with a parade, lobster boat racing, vintage car shows, a chicken barbecue dinner, fireworks, and

so much more. For an unforgettable experience, attend the **New England's Auto Auction at Owl's Head Transportation Museum** on August 26.

And no visit to Maine is complete without a ferryboat ride to **Monhegan Island**. 10 miles offshore, this magical island has ignited the creativity of painters Winslow Homer, and the Wyeths. Wander through the forest of fairy houses then hike on to view gorgeous vistas from highest cliffs on the Maine coast.

FALL LEAF PEEPING

As the weather begins to cool down, fall arrives bringing the smells of burning wood, sounds of crunching leaves, tastes of crisp apples and sweet cider, and brilliant yellows, oranges and reds paint the fall landscape in Midcoast Maine.

In October on Columbus / Indigenous weekend, 70 enormous gourds are transformed into pieces of artwork which line the streets of Damariscotta and Newcastle for the annual **Damariscotta Pumpkinfest & Regatta**. Tens of thousands of

visitors from around the world arrive for a fun-filled family weekend full of games and adventure, street performers, a parade, delicious food, music, and a regatta in hollowed out pumpkins, motorized or with paddles. A memorable weekend of just good old-fashioned fun.

For a bit of shopping adventure, make sure your trip will include the first Saturday of November for our annual **Early Bird Sale**. Shopping starts at some businesses at 6 am and other businesses offer

discounts all day long. If you wear your PJs, extra discounts are extended. It's a great way to kick off the holiday season while supporting local businesses.

The Wiscasset, Waterville & Farmington Railway Museum is a great place to celebrate autumn in the Sheepscot Valley at its annual fall festival. Enjoy steam train rides, Model T railcar rides, a pumpkin patch, children's games, live music, and hayrides.

WINTER WONDERLAND

Winter in Maine becomes a very special place as the days become short on light and long on night. What's not to love about curling up in front of a warm fire enjoying a cup of hot cocoa or venturing outdoors after a recent snowfall to make snow angels or build a snowman? And if you're lucky, you may catch sight of a Barred Owl perched on a branch enjoying the peacefulness of winter. For the young at heart, head out to one of Maine's dozen ski areas, or 14,000 miles of groomed trails for snowmobiling, preserves for snowshoeing and lakes and ponds for ice fishing.

Thanksgiving weekend, the Twin Villages of Damariscotta and Newcastle come alive with the start of the holiday season. The sidewalks are lined with decorated Christmas trees, storefronts become magical holiday scenes filled with lights, and Santa makes his first appearance during the **Villages of Light** parade. A hop, skip and a jump away is New England's biggest and brightest light display at the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens in Boothbay for Gardens Aglow. Bundle up and get ready to get in the holiday spirit as you walk through 14 acres of gardens lit with 750,000 LED

lights that may be in the shape of flowers, animals, or mushrooms.

The traditional ice harvest at the **Thompson Ice House** in South Bristol is a fun-filled event for all ages. The free event attracts crowds every February to participate or watch as a crew of volunteers cut large blocks of ice from Thompson Pond using antique tools in much the same way it has been done since 1826. Whether its time spent indoors or outdoors on an adventure, Maine is a wonderful place for a relaxing winter getaway.

“NAPA VALLEY OF Oysters”



The Damariscotta River in Midcoast Maine is famous for its oysters – often referred to as the “Napa Valley of Oysters.” Did you know that oysters are packed with vital nutrients and vitamins, such as zinc, calcium, magnesium, protein, selenium, iron, and Vitamins A and B12?

Thousands of years ago, shell heaps made up mostly of oyster shells lined the banks of the Damariscotta River (Abenaki for “river of many fishes”) deposited there by Native Americans. These oyster middens tell a story about how the native people feasted on this delicacy. You can see the Shell Middens off Business Route 1, across from the Great Salt Bay school. There is a parking lot and a lovely dog-friendly walk down

to the river where you can see them across the water.

The European settlers in the 1700s built mills, dams, and shipyards, which led to erosion along the banks of the river, which eventually led to the disappearance of the oyster.

Today, the river boasts the perfect climate for harvesting oysters. The waters are cleaner and warmer with the right level of salinity mixed with fresh water (oysters can filter up to 50 gallons of water a day!). Commercial oyster growing and the prolific spawning has brought back the wild American oyster in salty/sweet abundance.

You too can become a connoisseur of oysters, which are offered at most

restaurants in the region. King Eider’s offers raw oysters, as well as roast oysters with a lobster cream sauce. Simmons Seafood Market in Damariscotta has several varieties of oysters to take home and enjoy in addition to their extensive seafood offering.

Take a River Cruise up the Damariscotta River where 80 percent of Maine oysters are farmed. Sunset is a particularly beautiful time to board an excursion to see harbor seals, osprey, and bald eagles, and learn about oyster farming.

Come find out what makes oysters from the Damariscotta River so special!

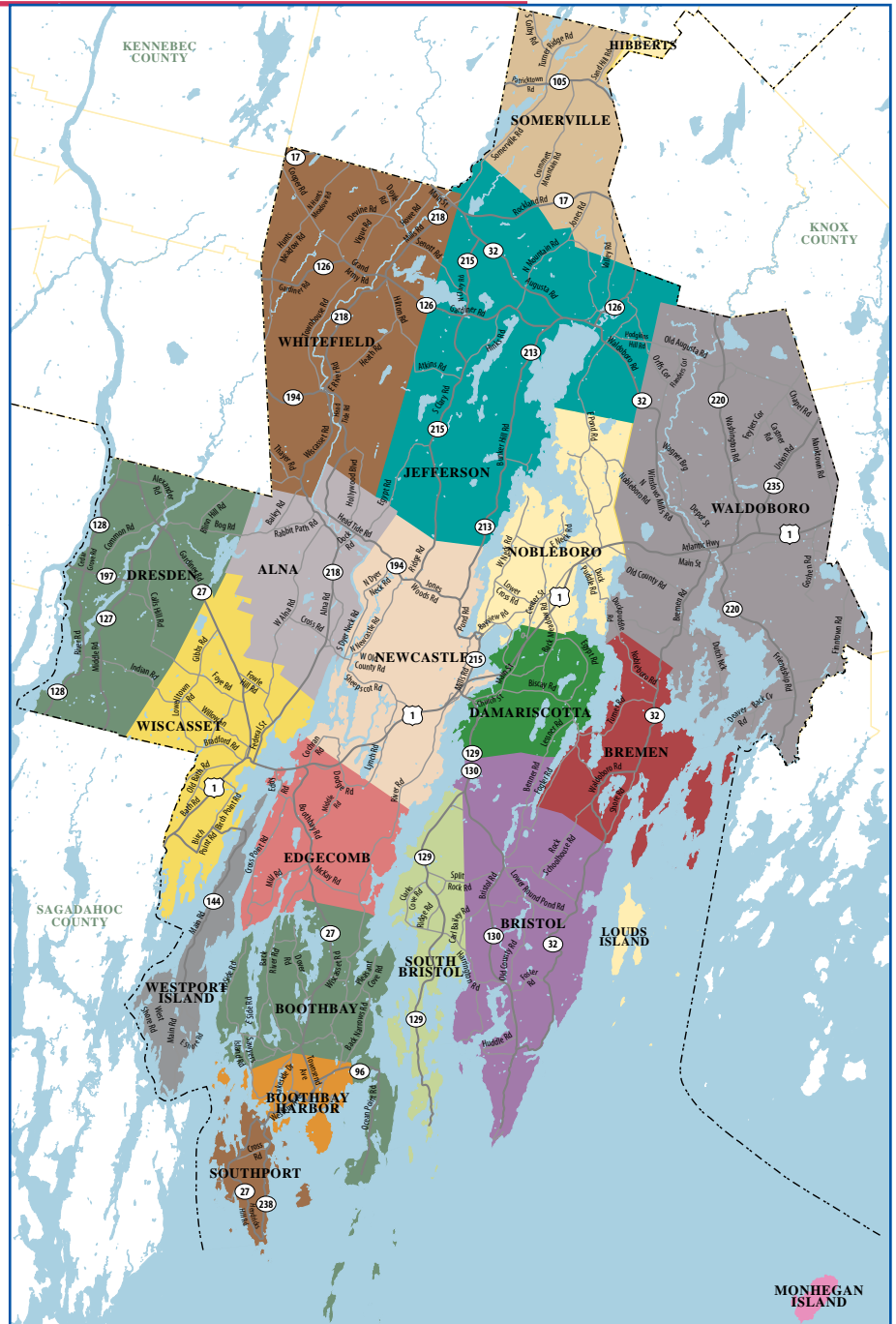

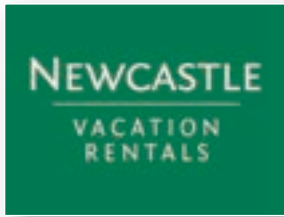

A short drive out of Damariscotta (take Biscay Road and turn right on Route 32) will take you to the charming small fishing village of Round Pond where you can experience **The Art of Antiquing**, a European and United Kingdom-sourced antiques business featuring incredible finds spanning the centuries. Continue south on Route 32 and you'll come to **Skipjack Nautical Wares & Marine Art Gallery**, a beautiful 200-year-old red barn offering nautical antiques and collectibles, marine art, lamps, ship salvage and décor.

For the person who loves vintage, look no further than **Pinky LaRue Fashionably Vintage** in the historic riverfront town of Waldoboro just 10 minutes north of Damariscotta. Browse clothes, records, home décor, and more.

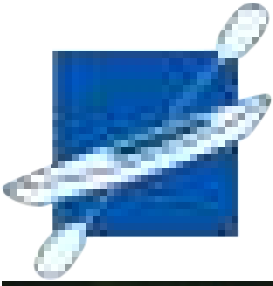

Maine has more than 65 lighthouses, which have become icons of coastal Maine, luring tens of thousands of visitors to the state each year. The midcoast area alone has 21 lighthouses adorning its coastline. Today, most lighthouses serve an aesthetic purpose versus a practical one, however, the one thing that bridges history are the stories of shipwrecks, survival, and secrets hidden inside each one.

The **Pemaquid Point Lighthouse**, commissioned by John Quincy Adams in 1827, has the Fisherman's Museum on the first floor in the Keeper's House. It has its own piece of history at the end of the peninsula. Located on the west side of the entrance to Muscongus Bay, its tower stands 79 feet above sea level with a light that is visible for 14 nautical miles. Built in 1835 and automated in 1934, the Lighthouse received its first fourth-order Fresnel lens in 1956. The lighthouse was the first in Maine to be automated, rather than being hosted by a keeper in 1934. Visitors can climb the winding stairwell to the top of the historic Pemaquid Point Lighthouse.

Each year the United States Coast Guard, the Maine Office of Tourism and the American Lighthouse Foundation attract between 15,000 to 18,000 visitors, offering the general public a unique opportunity to climb and learn about more than two dozen historic Maine lights. The 2023 Maine Open Lighthouse Day

is September 9, 2023 from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. The lighthouses listed below can be easily visited from the midcoast area. Check out the website for a complete listing of lighthouses that are a part of the 2023 Open Lighthouse day at www.lighthousefoundation.org.

MIDCOAST LIGHTHOUSES

Pond Island 1821 - 20-foot white cylindrical tower, summit of island. West side of Kennebec River entrance, view from Popham Beach, Phippsburg.

Doubling Point 1898 - 14-ft white wooden octagonal tower on granite pier with footbridge to shore. East bank.

Squirrel Point 1898 - White wooden octagonal tower. East bank Kennebec River, Georgetown, view from Parker Head Road, Phippsburg Center.

Perkins Island 1898 - White wooden octagonal tower. West side of island, Kennebec River, view from Parker Head Road, Parker Head.

Seguin Island 1795/1887 - 53-foot white cylindrical tower, 2 miles south of Kennebec River mouth, Georgetown, view from Popham Beach

Hendricks Head 1829/1875 - 39-foot white square tower, privately owned, Southport Island, Sheepscot River,

Burnt Island 1821 - 26-foot white conical tower. West side, Boothbay Harbor entrance, Southport; view from Spruce Point, Boothbay Harbor.

Pemaquid Point - 32-foot white fieldstone conical tower, Pemaquid 1827/1857 Bristol, end of Route 130.

The Cuckolds 1892/1907 - 48-foot white wooden octagonal tower atop dwelling. Off Cape Newagen, west side entrance to Boothbay Harbor, view from town dock, Newagen.

Ram Island 1883/1977 - 30-foot white cylindrical tower, northwest side of island, east side of Boothbay Harbor entrance, view from Ocean Point, Route 96, East Boothbay.

Monhegan 1824/1850 - 47-foot gray granite conical tower, 10 miles offshore, Monhegan Island, via car ferry from Boothbay Harbor, New Harbor, Port Clyde.

Franklin Island 1805/1857 - 37-foot white cylindrical tower, northwest side of island, Muscongus Bay, Friendship.

Marshall Point 1832/1858 - 25-foot white granite tower with footbridge. Southern tip of Marshall Point, east side southern entrance to Port Clyde Harbor entrance, view Lighthouse Road off Route 131. St. George.

Tenants Harbor 1857 - 26-foot white cylindrical tower, privately owned. East side of Southern Island, view from the village.

Two Bush Island 1897 - 42-foot white square tower. Off Tenant's Harbor, north side Two Bush Channel.

Whitehead Island 1807/1852 - 34-foot gray granite tower, west side, southern entrance to Muscle Ridge Channel. Off Tenant's Harbor, St. George.

Rockland Breakwater 1888/1902 - 18-foot white square tower atop fog signal house. North side, Rockland Harbor entrance, Rockland.

Owl's Head Lighthouse 1825 - 20-ft white brick conical tower, south entrance to Rockland Harbor, view from Lighthouse Road off Route 73.

Indian Island 1850/1874 - 31-ft white square tower, privately owned, no longer active. East side off Rockport entrance, view from Rockport Marine Park.

Curtis Island 1836/1896 - 26-foot white cylindrical tower. Camden Harbor entrance, view from Bay View Street, Camden.

Grindel Point 1851/1874 - 32-foot white pyramidal tower, privately owned. Islesboro, auto ferry from Lincolnville Beach; north side entrance to Gilkey Harbor.

NEWCASTLE | EDGECOMB

~ half mile loop

Mills Overlook Preserve – A hilly, wooded loop with rocky outcrops and scenic views of Damariscotta Mills.

~ primary loop 0.8 miles

Marsh River Bog – A relatively flat, forested loop trail alongside a beautiful bog, just off of Route 1.

~ 1.75 miles

Baker Forest – A steep climb from the trailhead leads to old logging roads and two loop trails winding through a beautiful mature forest community. A good place to spot spring ephemeral flowers and signs of moose.

~ 5.7 miles of trails

Dodge Point Public Land (State of Maine) – A local favorite, with broad vistas of the Damariscotta River and gravelly beaches. Trails include a mix of old farm roads and wooded paths. Coastal Rivers maintains a deep water dock at the shore for public use.

~ 5 miles from one trailhead to the other

River-Link Trail – River-Link is a collaborative land conservation initiative among numerous state, municipal and non-profit partners to create a trail and wildlife corridor along the Boothbay Peninsula. Travel through miles of stream valleys and wooded uplands without crossing a road, and look for many signs of wildlife as well as the remnants of past human settlement.

SOUTH BRISTOL

~ 1 mile out and back

Walpole Woods (Town of South Bristol) – Two trails intersect with woodland roads, creating a loop. Man-made Birkett Pond is a sweet out-of-the-way spot, and springs, stone walls, and gravel pits on the property attest to layers of human use over the centuries.

~ primary loop 1.9 miles

Plummer Point Preserve – Featuring lovely coastal spruce forest with over a mile of shoreline along the Damariscotta River. Enjoy rocky points, old quarries, and views of both Seal Cove and Long Cove. A deep water dock is available for public use.

~ 0.75 mile loop

Stratton Island Preserve – Coastal Rivers' first and largest island. A stunning loop through coastal spruce woods is richly carpeted with moss. Please avoid nesting eagles on the north end.

~ 1.2 mile loop

Seal Cove Shore Preserve – This magical trail follows a ridge before dropping down to cross primeval wetland to the start of a one-mile loop along Seal Cove.

~ 1.6 miles

Tracy Shore (Town of South Bristol) – Trails wind past vernal pools, cascading streams, and cliffs draped in rock tripe and ferns to arrive at an overlook with stunning views of Jones Cove and the Damariscotta River. Steep drop—use caution with children and dogs.



~ 0.5 mile loop

Library Park – Short and sweet, and quite steep in spots. This gem of a preserve, tucked behind Rutherford Library, offers views of Johns Bay and Witch Island.

~ 0.6 mile loop

Witch Island Preserve – A day-use island with its own trail system, the island is a favorite local picnic spot.

~ 0.75 miles out and back

Rutherford Island Preserve – A fairy-land trail winds among stone walls and coastal spruce. The route is "in and back" to a lookout and bench on the Damariscotta.

~ 250 feet of trail

Little Thrumcap Island (USFWS) – Essential Roseate tern habitat and part of the Maine Coastal Islands National Wildlife Refuge. A traditional day trip destination with a great beach and wide ocean views. Please observe seasonal closures for nesting birds.

DAMARISCOTTA

~ 3.0 miles of trails

Salt Bay Farm – A mix of habitats make the Farm a regional birding destination. Highlights include salt and freshwater wetlands with a viewing platform, trails through forest and fields on Great Salt Bay, a popular sledding hill, and Twin Villages Foodbank Farm.

~ 1 mile loop

Doyle Preserve – Off the beaten track, a moderate walk through the woods brings you to the shore of Pemaquid Pond.

~0.4 miles round trip

Huston Landing – The trail descends gently through a field, and then winds down to the shore to a unique geologic formation called a tombolo. A lovely spot to watch the sun set over the Damariscotta River.

BREMEN | WALDOBORO

~0.7 miles out and back

Pemaquid Pond Preserve – A gentle woodland walk takes you to the Pemaquid Pond shoreline, with gorgeous lake views and flat rocks for lounging.

~primary loop 1.1 miles

Hilton O'Connor Trail (Town of Bremen) – An easy to moderate hike, with opportunities for birdwatching. The route passes through a winding salt marsh, mature stands of red oak and white ash, and verdant fern alleys.

~0.6 miles out and back

Osborn Finch Wildlife Sanctuary – A short trail from the parking area to flat-rocked banks on the Medomak River makes this an excellent picnic spot and an ideal walk for all ages.

BRISTOL

~0.6 mile loop

Cosima's Preserve – This hidden gem has much to offer: a variety of habitats with good opportunities for viewing wildlife, a quiet wooded trail, a ledge overlooking the Pemaquid River perfect for picnics, stone walls, and impressive ledge outcrops.

~2.2 mile loop

Keyes Woods Preserve – Historic rock walls and foundations, abundant signs of wildlife, a hemlock-shaded stream, and extensive frontage along the Pemaquid River are among the highlights of this quiet preserve.

~trails total 0.3 miles

Bass Rock Preserve – A short, easy to moderate walk to the shore offers outstanding views of Muscongus Bay toward Friendship and the bay's many islands.

~1.7 miles of trails

Bearce Allen & NORGAL Preserves – A beautiful woodland trail with interpretive signage about tree ID and sustainable forestry practices. The easy Gale's Trail loop into NORGAL Preserve adds about half a mile. Visit in spring to see the many Pink Lady's Slipper orchids.

~trails total 0.6 miles

Hatchtown Preserve – A short, relatively easy hike along a quiet section of the Pemaquid River. Also accessible by canoe or kayak. A great spot to find spring wildflowers, listen for spring peepers, or watch for birds.

~trails total 0.7 miles

John & Peg Sproul Preserve – Trails to either side of the parking area offer views of Boyd's Pond and Ross Pond respectively. Mature woodlands, beaver dams, and porcupine habitat make for a lovely walk in a secluded part of the peninsula.

~2.5 mile loop

Crooked Farm Preserve – Nearly 140 acres of forest, wetlands, and open fields are ideal for walking, hunting, and fishing. The trail includes picturesque stretches along the Pemaquid River. Tends to be buggy in summer!

~0.7 miles of trails

Bristol Recreational Trail (Town of Bristol) – An easy to moderate trail looping along the tidal Pemaquid River behind Bristol Consolidated School. Highlights include beautiful views with well-placed benches, some fine old red oaks, and bridges over a winding brook.

~2.4 miles of trails

La Verna Preserve – Pass through mature forest, over Meadow Brook, and along historic stone walls, to almost a mile of breathtaking rocky coastline. This popular preserve offers panoramic views of outer Muscongus Bay and many islands, including far-off Monhegan.

A ferry ride to **Monhegan Island** will deliver you to the place that inspired the Wyeths and Winslow Homer before them. Spend a night and set your alarm. You won't want to miss the early morning light.

Back on the mainland, our downtown features several art galleries and shops. **The Sarah Richards Lyn Snow Gallery** showcases watercolor paintings, prints, mugs and clothing featuring the work of Sarah Richards and her Mom, Lyn Snow. **The Peace Gallery** is a unique gallery showcasing the creative works of fellow veterans from far and wide. They also offer various classes throughout the summer.

Plan a drive to the peninsula to visit the Pemaquid Lighthouse and several stops

along the way to experience Maine art. **The Kefauver Studio and Gallery** on the Bristol Road features a collection of paintings and prints of landscape artist Will Kefauver. Continue on to discover the studio of **Susan Bartlett Rice**, our cover artist, known for capturing the waterways and landscape in a lyrical, colorful way.

The **Pemaquid Craft Co-op** has a variety of displays from 60 crafters. You'll have a hard time deciding what treasure to take home. Your next stop will be the **Saltwater Artists Gallery** which showcases up to 25 artists exhibiting paintings, pastels, prints, photography as well as 3-D work including sculptures, glass, pottery, woodturning, and jewelry. As you enter through the guard station facing the beautiful Pemaquid Lighthouse, turn to your right and make sure you stop into the **Pemaquid Art Gallery**, which has a wonderful variety of original artwork from local artists in a

variety of mediums. Take in the dramatic views of the Atlantic Ocean and breathe in the salt air. Another glorious day in Maine.

Love quilting? **207 Longarm Quilting**, located in Jefferson, provides quality quilting services to help you create your own masterpiece, as well as restoration for those well-loved heirloom quilts that may need a little care and repair.

In addition to art galleries and shops, entertainment abounds in our area. We are fortunate to have ever-changing access to many diverse cultural events, including choral and musical ensembles and a wide variety of local bands and outdoor summer concerts. Check out **Clarks Cove Farm and Inn** for their Summerthing bands-in-a-barn schedule.
